

Residential Electronics Recycling for Wauconda

The Village of Wauconda, in cooperation with the Village of Island Lake and Wauconda Township, is happy to offer the residents of our community an opportunity to recycle residential electronic devices. "Residential Electronics" are defined as electronic devices that are generated from households only. This excludes electronic devices that were used in institutional, governmental or commercial business.

Please follow our simple rules:

- Residents who are dropping off materials must live in Lake County.
- Only Residential Waste can be dropped off. The program can not accept materials from commercial or industrial locations.
- Electronic items must be delivered free of any packaging materials and without manuals or software.
- Examples of acceptable Residential Electronics include central processing units, monitors, televisions, computer peripherals (keyboards, speakers, printers, etc.), home office equipment (fax machines, all-in-one printers etc.), small home appliances (vacuum cleaners, toasters, etc.), and consumer electronics (radios, stereos, etc.) as outlined in Exhibit 1 below.

This is not a Chemical Waste Collection Program

Remember this is not a Household Chemical Waste collection program and all chemical waste, including batteries and fluorescent light bulbs, should be taken to a SWALCO Household Chemical Waste Collection site.

The Program Plan has Two (2) Parts

Our Residential Recycling Plan is a two-part approach with both weekday and weekend drop off times, which we hope allows more opportunity for resident participation.

Part 1 - Saturdays:

Electronic Recycling will be conducted on the first Saturday of each month. The location for the weekend collection program will be at the Wauconda Township Facility on Bonner Road. The hours of operation will be 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., and members of our Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) will be on hand to direct you when you arrive.

Part 2 - Weekdays:

Weekday collection will be conducted Monday through Friday at the Wauconda Public Works Facility, located at 302 Slocum Lake Road in Wauconda. Operating hours for weekday collections are Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Residents must bring the items into the Public Works Facility, register with the clerk, and deposit the items into the collection boxes. The weekday service is an Indoor Drop Off program only.
